
#### Welcome



**Work Experience Week - Nursing** 

**Dates: 15<sup>th</sup> – 19<sup>th</sup> February 2021** 

Age: 16+

Application Deadline: 25th January 2021

During the Speakers for School Virtual Work Experience you will take part in a range of sessions, meet nurses working across the different branches of nursing and in different roles, and gain knowledge of skills needed to start a career in nursing and other fields. You will take part in interactives sessions, talks and tasks, and have lots of opportunities to ask questions.

You will find out about different areas of nursing (adult nursing, children's nursing, learning disability nursing, and mental health nursing) and some of the different roles available; how you can get into nursing, and what you can do now to get the skills you need to apply. You'll get to meet a variety of nurses and hear their stories and advice, including how they have developed their career, the impact Covid-19 has had on them and their role, and what they love (and hate) about being a nurse.

At the end of the week you will have developed skills and an understanding of this exciting career.

You will need to have internet and computer access for the duration of the week. Somewhere quiet to work from 9am – 3pm, Monday to Friday. Lunch and breaks will be taken during the day to be arranged during the work experience. We'll send you a full schedule the week before. The work experience is delivered using Google Classrooms that meets all GDPR and Safeguarding requirements. You will need to join each session every day
