Letter of application

Please include a letter of application, addressed to the Headteacher. It should not exceed 2 sides of A4, font Tahoma size 11.

- 2. What makes you a great teacher
- 3. Your personality and what makes you unique
- 4. What positive impact you could have on our school

Shortlisted candidates
