

The Deanery High School Catch Up Plan: October 2021

This document is regularly updated as new strategies are adopted.

Context

The Government have pledged £1 billion of funding to support children across the country who have experienced unprecedented disruption to their education as a result of COVID-19.

This includes £650 million catch up premium for 2020-2021 academic year to ensure schools have the support they need to help all pupils make up for lost teaching time.

School leaders must be able to account for how this money is being used to achieve the goal of schools getting back on track and teaching a normal curriculum as soon as possible. There must be appropriate transparency for parents (plans on website?) and scrutiny by Governors.

In addition, there is a £350 million investment into a National Tutoring Programme to provide additional, targeted support for children and young people needing the most help.

Available Resources

1. Government Coronavirus catch up premium

In 2020-2021 We have received £59,180 catch up premium funding.

In 2021-2022 we will receive £42,129 catch up funding, plus an additional £42,525, ringfenced for school-led tutoring.

2. National Tutor Programme (NTP)

Consists of two parts:

- 5-16 programme high quality tuition available from the second half of the Autumn term
- 16-19 fund to provide small group tutoring for disadvantaged 16-19 students

Schools can use catch up funding to cover the subsidised cost of the programme (up to 75% subsidised)

There are two aspects to the NTP:

- A) Tuition Partners: Subsidised tuition from a list of approved partners available to schools from November 2020
- B) Academic Mentors: schools in disadvantaged areas are supported to employ in-house academic mentors to provide small group tuition (via Teachfirst)

3. Our current staff and resources

We have a wealth of expertise within school already to help support pupils. Some of the most effective methods may be very low cost, including high quality teaching, effective feedback, ensuring pupils are fully resourced for independent learning and are supported in their wellbeing and in developing resilience.

"The aggregate impact of lost time in education will be substantial, and the scale of our response must match the scale of the challenge" DfE

However, the strategy should be underpinned by a calm and measured approach rather than a 'panic' to 'catch up' and save the 'lost generation'. We will need to instil confidence in pupils, developing their knowledge, resilience, character and self-belief.

We have adopted the EEFs suggested approach consisting of three aspects:

- 1) TEACHING (PLUS OUR WHOLE SCHOOL STRATEGIES)
- 2) TARGETED ACADEMIC SUPPORT
- 3) WIDER STRATEGIES
