Destination Data:

Our careers strategy and programme helps our students to develop personal and employability skills which in turn means that our students make positive transitions and achieve good destinations. All students have a one to one careers guidance interview, beginning from Y9 onwards. Students who are in care, SEND or deemed vulnerable are prioritised, however every student has at least one such face to face before the end of the spring term in year 11 and at least 2 individual guidance sessions in the 6th form. Students who are vulnerable or are lacking aspiration have multiple guidance sessions to support them as they progress through school.

Our destination data is used to:

- > Determine where students go after leaving School & 6th Form
- > Track subjects' students go on to study, as well as employment areas, courses and apprenticeships.
- > Track actual destinations with intended
- Ensure that all students in Y11 prior to leaving have completed at least one application to post 16 learning
- Cross-match intended destinations with appropriateness of provision based on our knowledge of the student and tracking of careers aspirations over the five year whilst at school
- Track students who were identified as being at greater risk of NEET and liaise with Aspiring Futures to offer additional support
- Offer contact with students once they leave School so further support can be provided through the summer or at a later stage
- > Celebrate the success of our students with staff, parents/carers and local community
- > Raise the career aspirations of students currently in school through examples of past pupils
- > Inform our careers provision
- Identify courses and opportunities so that our careers leader is up to date with the changing landscape
- > Adapt our careers programme to offer a range of opportunities to students

2021 Participation rates have improved from the previous year and are higher than the Wigan average. There is a slight drop in the number of students who have progressed into FE, but a significant increase in the number of pupils who gained apprenticeships. There are no 'Not Knowns' and the percentage of NEET is significantly smaller than the previous year.

6th Form destination data is collected and tracked inhouse. August 2021 saw 93% of Students who wished to study at University accepted to their first choice University.
