Introduction and principles

School uniform plays an important role in establishing the ethos of a school and is strongly encouraged by the DfE.

The Government, although it has published guidance, has made it clear that it is for the school's Governing Body to decide whether there should be a uniform and other rules relating to appearance, and if so, what they should be. Therefore this document seeks to clarify the Governors' expectations at The Deanery Church of England High School and Sixth Form College with regard to uniform and appearance.

An actual list of the items pupils are permitted to wear is included. This includes particular items parents can apply to the Headteacher for permission to wear. A judgement will be made with regard to any request based on whether the item is in sympathy with the Christian ethos of the school or any other judgement including health or safety. The Headteacher, in conjunction with Pastoral colleagues, will consider each application and reach a decision as soon as possible but until such time that a decision is made the item should not be worn for school.

Rationale

The Deanery Church of England High School & Sixth Form College believes in high standards, high aspirations and the highest expectations in every aspect of its operation.

The school has a strict uniform policy, ensuring that students are fully focused on learning as opposed to fashion. The school is a place of work and students are expected to take pride in their appearance. The school uniform provides students with many positive advantages, because uniform:

- Diminishes the social exclusion of students based on what they are wearing
- Reduces family tension as students do not have to compete with their peers for the latest trends in clothes
- Is most cost effective to parents in the long run
- Encourages pride in personal appearance and being part of the school community
- Promotes safety, particularly through making it easier to identify strangers
- Makes students ambassadors for the school in the local community
- Supports discipline and good behaviour

Sanctions

The uniform policy will be strictly enforced. Every opportunity will be given for pupils to conform and rectify any identified issues with support from school. All students are expected to wear the full school uniform from the moment they leave their home in the morning until they arrive home in the afternoon. Students are representing the school at all times and should be proud to be part of the school community. Any student bringing the school into disrepute by not adhering to the uniform policy will receive sanctions.

School uniform will be checked by staff as pupils enter school in the morning, in all lessons and as pupils leave the school buildings.

- If students are not in full uniform, they will not be able to attend lessons or spend break or lunchtimes in general circulation. Pupils may be offered school-issued uniform to wear, including shoes.
- All items of uniform should be clearly marked or labelled.
- Students wearing make-up, false eyelashes, jewellery or nail varnish will be expected to remove it - any student not complying with this request will be subject to school sanctions.

Detailed guidance

We give below some notes for guidance and clarification. School uniform lists can sometimes seem over detailed and over particular. Our experience is that we prevent misunderstandings by being very precise about our requirements. **We do not wish parents to spend money on items we do not allow to be worn.** It should be noted that not all items under 'school uniform' in some stores fulfil our school's uniform requirements. The full support of parents is requested with regard to their children wearing the correct uniform.

Please note: Our uniform suppliers are governed by The Schoolwear Association. The Schoolwear Association is committed to ensuring a long-term, robust and competitive market for the supply of schoolwear exists and that parents, pupils and schools all get a fair deal.

In cold weather, it is expected that boys will wear their rugby shirt or Deanery hoodie/$\frac{3}{4}$ top and Deanery tracksuit bottoms, or plain navy/ black tracksuit bottoms for warmth.</p> <p>It is expected that girls will wear their Deanery hoodie/$\frac{3}{4}$ top and Deanery leggings or plain black/navy thick leggings.</p> <p>Pupils may not wear any other type of sports clothing; this is our uniform. Pupils do NOT get changed at school for PE, they attend in their PE uniform.</p>

Bags

We cannot provide locker facilities for all students and so a good-sized back pack is required for carrying books, equipment and outside coats. Fashion bags, carrier bags and drawstring kit bags are not suitable for carrying text books and school equipment.

Other subject specific requirements

Aprons for Food and Technology subjects can be purchased directly from school or our three official school uniform suppliers.

If in doubt, do not buy; please check with the school first. The school will make a final decision on any item considered unsuitable.

The school values and recognises the diversity of cultures, religions and disabilities of its students and will take a sensitive approach when this affects dress requirements. Hijabs worn for religious purposes must not cover the face. Turbans, kippahs, and headscarves are supported on religious grounds but must not compromise health and safety.
