

UNIFORM POLICY

The Deanery Church of England High School

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The full support of parents is expected with regard to their children wearing the correct uniform. If in doubt, do not buy; please check with the school first. The school will make a final decision on any item considered unsuitable.

1 Rationale

The Deanery Church of England High School believes in high standards and the highest expectations. It has a strict uniform policy, ensuring that pupils are fully focused on learning as opposed to fashion. The school is a place of work and pupils are expected to take pride in their appearance. The school uniform provides pupils with many positive advantages, because uniform:

- o Diminishes the social exclusion of pupils based on what they are wearing
- o Means pupils do not have to compete with their peers for the latest trends in clothes
- o Is most cost effective to parents in the long run
- o Encourages pride in personal appearance and being part of the school community
- o Promotes safety, particularly through making it easier to identify strangers
- o Makes pupils ambassadors for the school in the local community
- Supports discipline and good behaviour

2 Sanctions

The uniform policy will be strictly enforced. Every opportunity will be given for pupils to conform and rectify any identified issues with support from school. All pupils are expected to wear the full school uniform from the moment they leave their home in the morning until they arrive home in the afternoon. Pupils are representing the school at all times and should be proud to be part of the school community. Any pupil bringing the school into disrepute by not adhering to the uniform policy will receive sanctions.

School uniform will be checked by staff as pupils enter school in the morning, in all lessons and as pupils leave the school buildings.

- If students are not in full uniform, they will not be able to attend lessons or spend break or lunchtimes in general circulation. Pupils will be offered school-issued uniform to wear, including shoes
- All items of uniform should be clearly marked or labelled
- Students wearing make-up, false eyelashes, jewellery or nail varnish will be expected to remove them - any student not complying with this request will be subject to school sanctions

3 Detailed guidance

School uniform lists can sometimes seem over detailed and over particular. **We do not wish parents to spend money on items that are not allowed**. It should be noted that not all items under 'school uniform' in some stores fulfil these uniform requirements.

Pupils must wear their PE uniform on PE days. Pupils may not wear any other type of sports clothing. Pupils do NOT get changed at school for PE; they attend school in their PE uniform. If girls persistently refuse to wear shorts of the correct length, they will be directed to wear leggings instead.				
Bags	All pupils are required to bring a bag every day. Locker facilities are not provided so a good- sized bag is required for carrying books, equipment and outside coats. Fashion bags, carrier bags and drawstring kit bags are not suitable.
