

## **Work Experience**

One of your enhancement options, is the opportunity to undertake unpaid, voluntary work experience, that will enhance your prospects and inform your possible future career path. The work experience placements usually begin before the October half-term, and so it is crucial that in order to organise a relevant placement, you are pro-active from the outset of September.

The process to arrange a work experience placement takes time, it involves the college undertaking placement approval, health and safety/risk assessments, etc. Therefore, we are encouraging you to consider/research potential work experience placements now, in order to ensure that the process is streamlined and you have a better chance of undertaking a placement successfully.

In terms of work placements, you are expected to organise/arrange your own placement by making enquiries with relevant employers - communicating and networking is a vital skill that you need to develop.

The Sixth Form team are on hand to offer advice and guidance related to work experience/placements/employers and will support you with the process, but you are to be responsible for arranging and facilitating the work experience yourselves.

Work experience is a fantastic opportunity to develop your skills set, and enhance your potential in your chosen area of employment. It also shows clear commitment to the sector that you have chosen to undertake experience in - something which both universities and employers love to see, and something that would give you further talking points in the competitive stages of apprenticeship, employment, or university applications.

With the above in mind, we would now encourage you to begin considering and shortlisting potential work experience placements that you think are relevant to your goals, and that you would like to undertake as your chosen option for enhancement. You will be very busy with your new subjects, studies and other extra-curricular opportunities from beginning with us in September, so now is an ideal time to start planning ahead.

Where I went: Rosebridge Court Care Home

**What I learnt:** I learned compassion and empathy towards to residents and to be able to help them as much as I can. **What I learnt:** I learnt how to work and function as a team, how an organisation works to help a community and how to be patient with individuals who may not understand everything.

It may also help in my future career as I understand how teams work.
